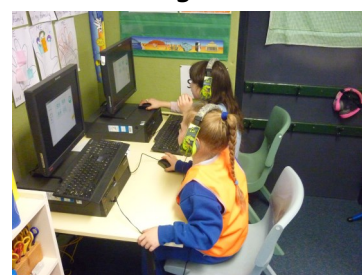
VIEW A TYPICAL KINDERGARTEN LITERACY LESSON IN ACTION



Mr Ping models the writing process to the whole class and establishes a word bank of useful words related to the topic, before sending the children off to write independently.

Each child works in groups of no more than three students to do guided reading. These groups are fluid and flexible and children are constantly moved as they progress.

Children work with white boards to practice their sounds and sight words.



Other independent activities include listening to PM readers on the computer and doing related activities as well as activities associated with the listening post.

After the modelled writing lesson, the children go to work independently to write their own sentences, making use of the word banks.

Then they bring their writing to me and I help them edit their work and assist them to continue writing more. Our Instructional Leader also works in each classroom on Mondays and Tuesdays.

All children have been presenting their prepared 60 second speech about their favourite toy. Two or three children from each class will be selected to present their speech at our assembly this Friday.

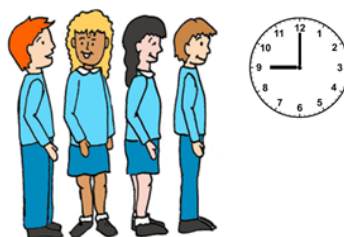
POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING FOCUS FOR THE NEXT FORTNIGHT.
