Year 1 Phonics Screener:

In Week 5 each child in Year 1 will sit with their class teacher to participate in a short assessment which will provide information on how your child is progressing in phonics. Each student will be asked to read 40 words aloud which include 20 real words and 20 nonsense words. The assessment includes pseudo or nonsense words to see if the student can use their knowledge of blending to read a word rather than their memory of having seen that word before. If you have any further questions, please talk to your child's class teacher.
